 - Prohibit commercial harvest for DBT
 - Prohibit take of any wild turtle eggs
 - Update civil restitution bounties
- Louisiana Turtle Conservation Plan
- FY 21-22 Priorities for SWG proposals
 - Investigate the current distribution, abundance, and genetics for DBT
- Gulf Coast DBT Conservation Action Plan (CAP)
- SEPARC/PARC TNT Workshop- Enhancing Cross-jurisdictional Partnerships to Confront the Illicit Turtle Trade in the SE U.S.
- State Herpetologist position
 - Vacant since June 2020, until recently





Previous Research/Survey Efforts

- USFWS State Wildlife Grants
 - Surveys of the Aquatic Turtle Fauna in Southwestern Louisiana, with Emphasis on Three Louisiana Species of Conservation Concern (Will Selman, Peter Lindeman, Eddie Lyons, Cybil Huntzinger, Irvin Louque, Jr. & Steve Shively-2011)
 - Evaluation of Diamondback Terrapin (Malaclemys terrapin) Nesting Habitat and Reproductive Productivity throughout Coastal Louisiana (Steven Pearson and Jon Wiebe- 2012)

Current Research/Survey Efforts

- Nicholls State University (*Timothy Clay*; tim.clay@nicholls.edu)
 - Mark-recapture surveys
 - 2020- trapped with fyke nets at Elmer's Island Wildlife Refuge (5x) and Rockefeller Wildlife Refuge (2x); trapped in June and just before Hurricane Laura, no terrapins were detected

- 2021- trapping began in early March at Elmer's Island; 1 terrapin detected
- Plans to survey at Elmer's Island and East Grand Terre this year
- Future work includes nest surveys
