• Currently 166 acres Enrolled & 7 lease holders


Aquaculture Parks: 38.7 acres & 16 lease holders



Hurricane Ida Impacts



Louisiana AOC Grants

- Initiative 4 of Louisiana Oyster Management and Rehabilitation Strategic Plan
- 3 years of funding
 - \$1.8M Infrastructure / \$217K in Outreach, Education, & Marketing
- Grants Available
 - AOC Park: Max Grant \$100K / Money Available \$300K / At least 3 Parks
 - AOC Nursery: Max Grant \$15K / Money Available \$150K / At least 10 Nurseries
 - AOC Grow-out: Max Grant \$45K / Money Available \$900K / At least 20 Farms
 - AOC Hatchery: Max Grant \$225K / Money Available \$450K / At least 2 Hatcheries
- 2022 First round of funding expected by next year
 - 1 New AOC Park
 - 1 New Private Hatchery
 - 6 Grow-out Farms
