

Landings through Sept 2025


- 412,572 metric tons or 1,357 million standard fish
 - Up 8% over 2024 for equivalent time (335,551 mt)
 - Down 5% from the previous five year average (435,014 mt)





2025 Gulf Menhaden Season


- In May, NOAA forecasted a higher than average hurricane season with 13-19 named storms of which 6-10 could become hurricanes including 3-5 major hurricanes.
- A number of high pressure systems and Sarahan dust reduced much of the activity through August.





2025 Gulf Menhaden Season

- In June, NOAA
 forecasted the Gulf dead
 zone to be average sized, covering
 approximately 5,574
 square miles.
- In July, measurement of the dead zone was estimated at only 4,402 square miles, the 15th smallest zone on record in 39 years of measurement.







2025 Projected Total Landings

Reported landings through August 2025	327,750
Mean landings for Sept-Nov (2022-2024)	84,519
2025 Projected Landings	412,269

- Decrease of 1.7% from 2024 (419,244 mt)
- Decrease of 1.1% from 5-year Average (416,711 mt)




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- Decrease of 1.7% from 2024 (419,244 mt)
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- Adding in October 2024 landings (8,129), total for 2025 may be ≈420,701 mt




Historical Landings and Nominal Fishing Effort through 2024





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October 2024's Preliminary 2025 Forecast

• NOAA Assumed:

- Projected 2024 landings 366,720 mt
- 2024 nominal fishing effort
 ~232,528 v-t-wks

2025 nominal fishing effort estimate of

~282,200 v-t-wks

Preliminary Forecast for 2025

~382,402 mt

❖ Fleet exceeding NOAA forecast – +8% in Sept, +10% for 2025

2025 Port Sampling

At the end of September, 616 samples have been completed or in the works of the target 900.

- Moss Point = 266
- Empire = 191 (+ 43 frozen)
- Abbeville = 116

Samplers are continuing to pick up samples from the plants through the end of the season.
