## The Problem - the "Graying of the Fleet"



#### **Aging Industry**

The average age of commercial fishermen is increasing.

In the Gulf - average age is 50 years+.



#### **No Deckhands**

Current fishermen report shortage/lack of young, qualified deckhands.



#### Where to start?

For those that may be interested in being a commercial fisherman, there is no clear roadmap or "first step."

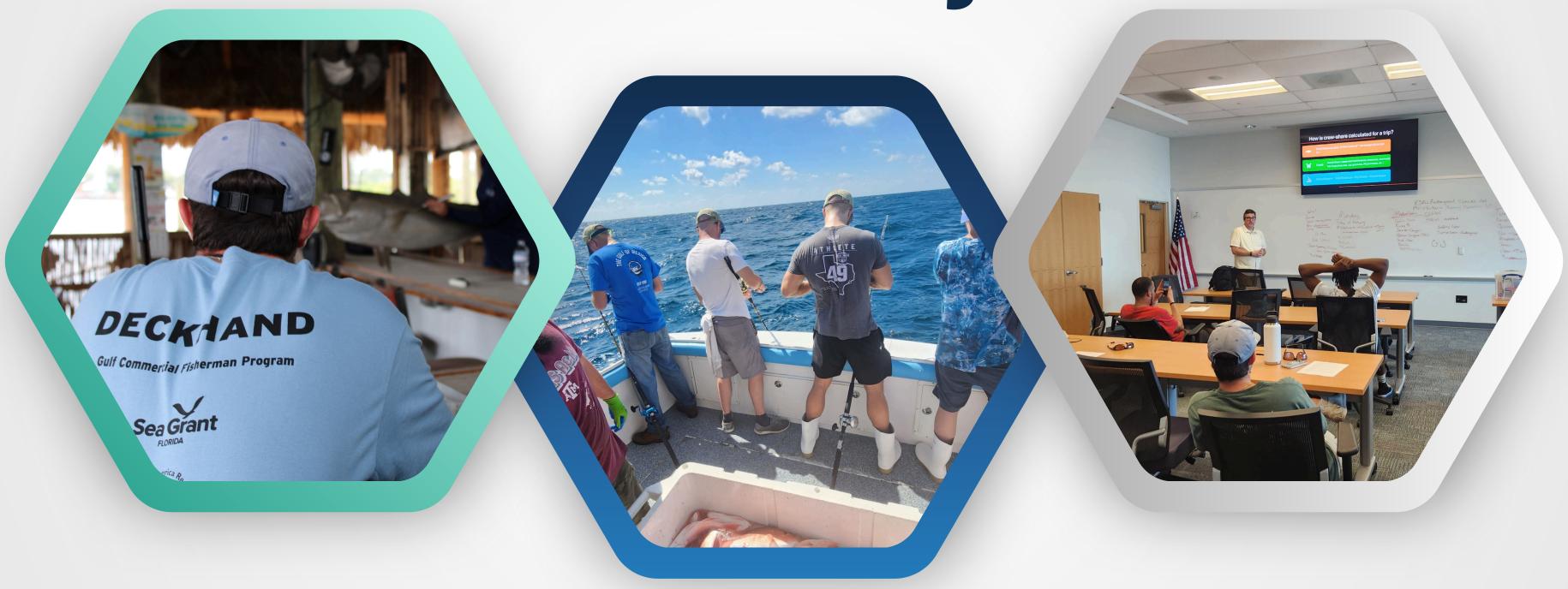


#### **Start up costs**

For those that want to make the leap to vessel owner, start up costs are high.

### **GCFP DEVELOPMENT**

January 2018 "Coordinating Team"
Established

Eric Brazer, Ashford Rosenberg, Bob Gill





## August 2018 - Convened a Planning Team

Coordinating Teams identified 8 highly respected "young" individuals who would bring knowledge and expertise to development.



## March 2018 - Research Phase

Coordinating team began researching other young fishermen training programs across the country

#### Fall 2019

Hosted webinars between SC and coordinators of other fishermen training programs





## December 2018 - Steering Committee Established

Acts as an "think tank." 25 respected leaders in fisheries across the Gulf (fishermen, processors, wholesalers, NGOs, etc).

## Fall 2019 - Development Grant from NFWF

Convened SC in-person do determine training program. structure and work plan for Gulf-specific training.



March 2020 - In-Person SC Meeting

20 members of the SC met in Tampa, FL to identify main priorities for training program.

#### 2020-2021 - Curriculum

#### Development

The PT met monthly via webinar to take direction from the SC and create a blueprint curriculum and communications plan for the program.





2021-2024

Submitted multiple grants to fund a pilot training program.

## 2021 - Curriculum approval by SC

The PT met monthly via webinar to take direction from the SC and create a blueprint curriculum and communications plan for the program.



## The GCFP Curriculum





#### **Shore Based + Field Training**

We developed a two-week shore-based curriculum which would be followed by a "training fishing trip" in the fishery of the students' choice.



#### Large Focus on Safety

The Gulf commercial fishing industry is inherently dangerous, so students would get in-depth safety training.



#### **Mentorship**

We would pair students with an industry mentor to provide guidance past the GCFP training.



#### **Financial Literacy**

Because fishing is not a typical 9-5 job with consistent pay, students receive financial training to plan around the highs and lows of fishing-based income.



#### Inclusive

It was important to the SC that someone's financial or learning status NOT be a barrier to participation in the GCFP. All budgets included funds for transportation, housing, and learning accommodations if necessary.



## WHERE ARE WENCY!

## October 2024

#### **GCFP Pilot - Galveston, TX**

- Proof of concept for training program
- Reef fish only
- Target 5 participants
- Shorter curriculum

#### The Results:

- 5 participants (2 local, 1 Dallas, 1 Anahuac, 1 North Carolina).
- Positive feedback from participants and industry members.
- No one got sea sick!



## May 2025

#### GCFP Pilot - Madeira Beach, FL

- Build on lessons learned from Galveston
- Modified agenda to focus on BLL
- Reef fish only
- Target 10 participants
- More diverse species

#### The Results:

- 5 participants (3 FL, 1 CA, 1 TX).
- Positive feedback from participants and industry members.
- No one got sea sick!



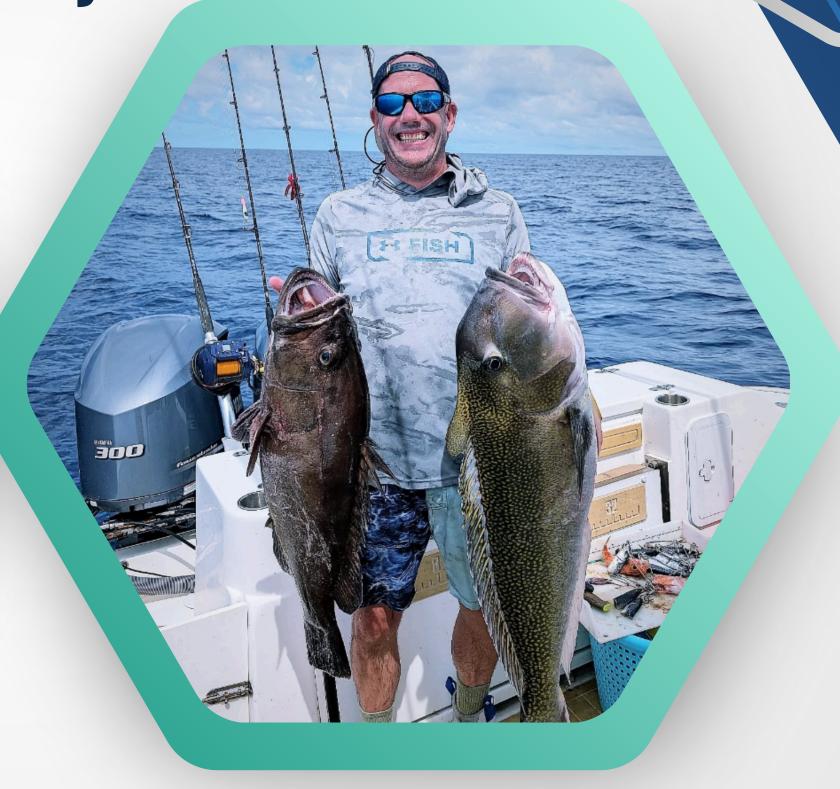
